Privacy Policy

Sunderland Strollers (the “Club”) is committed to protecting and respecting your privacy. For any personal data you provide for the purposes of your membership, the Club is the Data Controller and is responsible for storing and otherwise processing that data in a fair, lawful, secure and transparent way and will comply with the provisions of the UK GDPR.

What personal data we hold on you

You may give the Club information about you by filling in forms at an event or online, or by corresponding with us by phone, e-mail or otherwise.

This includes information you provide when you register with the Club as a Member or as part of the beginners’ course or participate in discussion boards on our Facebook pages or Spond.

The information you give us may include your name, date of birth, address, e-mail address, phone number, name of any other England Athletics (“EA”) affiliated clubs with which you are registered and gender (“**Athletics Data**”).

We may also ask for relevant health and medical information which is classed as special category personal data.

We ask you to inform us in the event that any of the information provided when joining the Club changes and to keep your profile on the EA MyAthletics Portal and Spond up to date. We will contact you from time to time and ask you to check that the information held is up to date.

Why we need your personal data

The reason the Club needs your Athletics Data is to be able to administer your membership and provide the membership services you are signing up to when you register with the Club.

The Club’s lawful basis for processing your personal is that we have a contractual obligation to you as a Member to provide the services you are registering for.

Reasons we need to process your data may include for example:

For training and competition entry

- sharing personal data with Club coaches, run leaders or officials to administer training sessions;
- sharing personal data with team managers to enter events;
- sharing personal data with facility providers to manage access to the track or check delivery standards; and



- sharing personal data with leagues, county associations and other competition providers for entry in events.

For funding and reporting purposes

- sharing anonymised data with a funding partner as condition of grant funding e.g. Local Authority;
- analysing anonymised data to monitor Club trends; and
- sending Club surveys to improve your experience as a Member.

For membership and Club management

- processing of membership forms and payments;
- sharing data with committee members to provide information about Club activities, membership renewals or invitation to social events;
- Club newsletter/emails promoting Club activity; and
- publishing of race and competition results.

Marketing and communications (where separate consent is provided)

- sending information about promotions and offers from sponsors; and
- sending information about selling Club kit, merchandise or fundraising.

Any special category health data we hold about you is only processed for the purpose of passing health data to Club officials to allow the safe running of training sessions. We process this data on the lawful basis of consent. Therefore, we will also need your explicit consent to process this data, which we will ask for at the point of collecting it.

The Club has a Members only Facebook social media page and uses Spond to manage Club sessions. All Members are free to join these sites. The Club also has a beginners group Facebook page. If you do join these sites, please note that they have their own privacy policies and that the Club do not accept any responsibility or liability for this policy. Please check the relevant policy before you submit any personal data on the Club social media pages.

The Club also currently has open social media pages on Facebook and Instagram.

Who we share your personal data with

When you become a Member of the Club, you will be registered as a member with EA unless you confirm to us that you do not wish this to take place, which will mean that you cannot be registered to enter events on behalf of the Club.

We will provide EA with your Athletics Data which they will use to enable access to the MyAthletics portal.



EA will contact you to invite you to sign into and update your MyAthletics portal. You can set and amend your privacy settings from the MyAthletics portal. If you have any questions about the continuing privacy of your personal data when it is shared with EA, please contact dataprotection@englandathletics.org.

The Club does not supply any personal data it holds for this purpose to any other third party. The Club does not store or transfer your personal data outside of the UK.

How long we hold your personal data

The Club will hold your personal data on file for as long as you are a Member. Requests for updates to the personal data we hold on you will take place, usually at membership renewal time. Any personal data we hold on you will be securely destroyed after four years of inactivity on that member's account, in line with EA's data retention policy. Your data is not processed for any further purposes other than those detailed in this policy.

Your rights regarding your personal data

As a data subject you may have the right at any time to request access to, rectification or erasure of your personal data; to restrict or object to certain kinds of processing of your personal data, including direct marketing; to the portability of your personal data and to complain to the UK's data protection supervisory authority, the Information Commissioner's Office about the processing of your personal data.

As a data subject you are not obliged to share your personal data with the Club. If you choose not to share your personal data with us, we may not be able to register or administer your membership.
